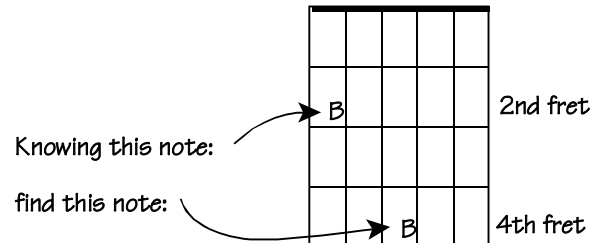
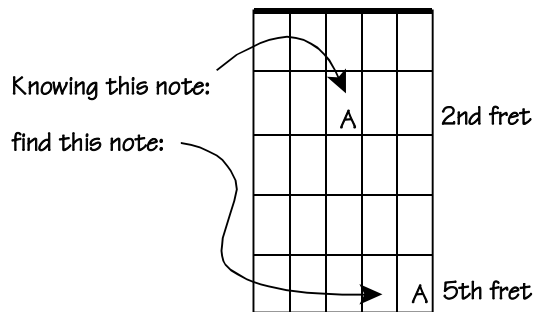


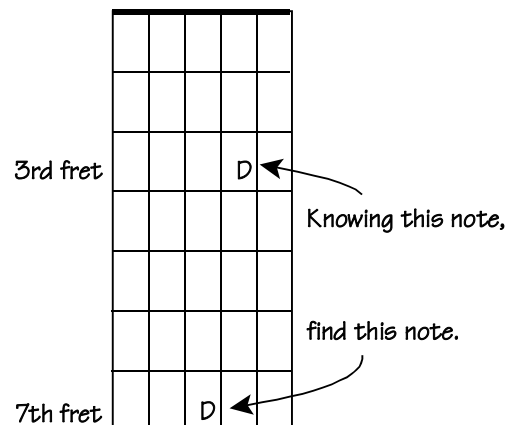
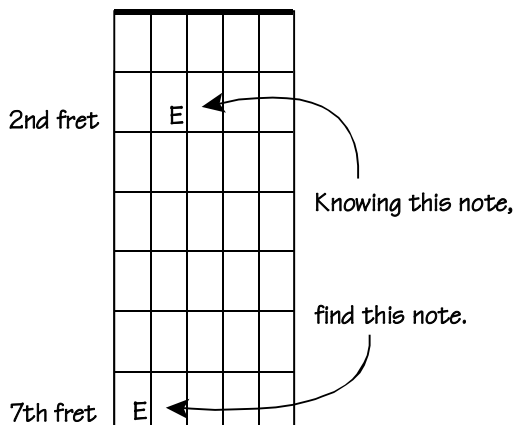
Finding Notes On The Guitar

(continued)

Rule 2) Finding the same note name an octave higher: On the 6th or 5th strings, move two strings higher and two frets higher. On the 4th or 3rd strings, move two strings higher and three frets higher. Examples:



Rule 3) Finding the same note on an adjacent lower string: On all but the 2nd string move one string lower and 5 frets higher. On the 2nd string, move one string lower and four frets higher. Examples:



Using rules 2 and 3, you can find any note on the guitar. Try this exercise: Start with F on the 6th string, 1st fret. Find F on the 4th string using rule 2, then with rule 3, find F on the 5th string. Now use rule 2 to find F on the 3rd string then on the 1st string. You should be at the 13th fret.
